

The Creative Connection Fund

The Creative Connection Fund is an operational fund that covers our daily expenses in order to avoid passing the burden of necessary costs to visitors through prohibitive fees and other financial barriers.

The NSCA seeks to raise \$150,000 by the end of 2024 to support costs related to facility maintenance, staff wages, and program expenses. Contributions to this operational fund ensure that the NSCA can continue to offer low cost programming for community members, host artists in exhibitions, facilitate consignment opportunities for small business owners, and invite talented creatives to lead educational opportunities.
